

August 14

- a. A song of praise to God who speaks in the thunder, the heavens roar with rain. Jeremiah 51:15-19
- b. With Babylon, the Lord's battle ax, He will shatter nations and destroy kingdoms. Jeremiah 51:20-23
- c. God will repay Babylon for all the wrongs they did against his people in Jerusalem. Jeremiah 51:24-35
- d. The Lord makes them drink until they fall asleep to never wake (handwriting on the wall). Jeremiah 51:39
- e. Get out, all of you who have escaped the sword! Don't watch. Flee while you can! Jeremiah 51:45-53
- f. For the Lord is destroying Babylon. He will silence her loud voice. Jeremiah 51:54-58
- g. During Jehoiachin's reign, King Nebuchadnezzar of Babylon besieges Jerusalem. 2 Kings 24:10-14
- h. Taking Jehoiachin prisoner Nebuchadnezzar made Mattaniah, now named Zedekiah, king. 2 Kings 24:15-17
- i. Zedekiah was 21 years old when he became king and reigned in Jerusalem 11 years. 2 Chron. 36:11-12
- j. Zedekiah rebelled on Nebuchadnezzar after he took an oath of loyalty in God's name. 2 Chron. 36:13
- k. King Zedekiah nor the people would listen and obey what the Lord said to Jeremiah. Jeremiah 37:1-8
- l. The Babylonians are not gone for good. They are coming back to burn the city down. Jeremiah 37:9-1

August 15

- a. Jeremiah is put in Jonathan's prison. Zedekiah gets him out, talks, changed prison. Jeremiah 37:11-21
- b. The officials lower Jeremiah into a muddy cistern, 30 men pull him out before he dies. Jeremiah 38:1-13
- c. King Zedekiah asks Jeremiah about him and his family. "You will not escape." Jeremiah 38:14-28
- d. Ezekiel sees visions of God, four living beings with four faces and four wings. Ezekiel 1:1-9
- e. Man/Reuben, Lion/Judah, Ox/Ephraim, Eagle/Dan, banners of Israel, also in Rev. 4:7. Ezekiel 1:10-25
- f. High on this throne was an appearance of a man with a glowing halo like a rainbow. Ezekiel 1:26-28
- g. Looked like the glory of the Lord (the man is Jesus in his deity, Revelation 5:6-14). Ezekiel 1:28
- h. The man called and commissioned Ezekiel sending him to the nation of Israel. Ezekiel 2:1-8
- i. A hand holding a scroll covered with funeral songs, words of sorrow and doom, he eats. Ezekiel 3:1-4
- j. The Spirit lifted me up and took me away to the colony of Judean exiles in Tel-abib. Ezekiel 3:5-15

August 16

- a. "Son of man, I have appointed you as a watchman for Israel." Warn them or else. Ezekiel 3:16-19
- b. If you don't warn them they'll die in their sins, and you're responsible, warn them. Ezekiel 3:20-22
- c. Go home, be tied with ropes, tongue stuck until God gives you a message. Ezekiel 3:23-27
- d. On a brick, draw a map of Jerusalem under siege and a wall around it for no escapes. Ezekiel 4:1-3
- e. Lay on your left side for 390 days, 1 day for each year of Israel's sin, 40 for Judah's sin. Ezekiel 4:4-8
- f. Ingredients mixed together for Ezekiel's bread is rationed with water for 390 days. Ezekiel 4:9-17
- g. The Lord tells Jeremiah to fasten a wooden yoke to his neck with a message for Judah. Jeremiah 27:1-15
- h. The gold articles won't be returned. Surrender to the king of Babylon and you will live. Jeremiah 27:16-17
- i. Hananiah falsely prophecies Babylon removing the yoke around their neck in two years. Jeremiah 28:1-4
- j. Jeremiah tells Hananiah you broke a wooden yoke. I have put an iron yoke on the nations. Jeremiah 28:5-14
- k. The Lord says Hananiah will die this year for his lies. He dies two months later. Jeremiah 28:15-17
- l. Babylon and her people will sink forever. The end of Jeremiah's messages. Jeremiah 51:59-64

August 17

- a. "Son of Man", cut hair in thirds as a sign of coming judgement on Jerusalem. Ezekiel 5:1-6
- b. A third will die in the city, a third will die outside the city, a third will be scattered. Ezekiel 5:7-17
- c. Message of judgement for the mountains of Israel: smashed idols, altars, and people. Ezekiel 6:1-14
- d. The end is here! Wherever you look – east, west, north, or south – your land is finished. Ezekiel 7:2
- e. Disaster after disaster is coming your way! (Three times Babylon attacked them) Ezekiel 7:3-13
- f. The trumpet calls Israel's army to mobilize, but no one listens. Ezekiel 7:14-27
- g. In a vision, the Spirit took me to the north Temple courtyard where a large idol is. Ezekiel 8:1-8
- h. 70 Israel leaders worshipping the idol, women weeping for Tammuz, 25 sunworshippers. Ezekiel 8:9-18
- i. Six punishers and a man wearing linen carrying a writer's case went into the Temple. Ezekiel 9:1-2
- j. Mark the foreheads, kill the ones without a mark, started with the 70 leaders. Ezekiel 9:3-10
- k. Man in the linen carrying the writer's case reported, "I have done as you commanded." Ezekiel 9:11

| h. This shows that King Zedekiah will leave Jerusalem at night through the wall. | Ezekiel 12:8-20 |
| i. Old: time passes, prophecies come to nothing. New: every prophecy will be fulfilled. | Ezekiel 12:21-28 |
| j. Sorrow awaits the false prophets who follow their imaginations having seen nothing. | Ezekiel 13:1-16 |
| k. Speak against women who prophecy from their own imaginations. Sorrow for them. | Ezekiel 13:17-23 |
