

August 28

- a. Lord, remember what has happened to us. Restore us and bring us back again. Lam. 5:1-22
- b. Obadiah's vision, "Get ready, everyone! Let's assemble our armies and attack Edom". Obadiah 1:1-9
- c. Edom is punished for the violence they did to their close relatives in Israel. Obadiah 1:10-14
- d. Edom, as you have done to Israel, so it will be done to you. Jerusalem will be a refuge. Obadiah 1:15-20
- e. Those who have been rescued will go up to Mt. Zion and the Lord himself will be king. Obadiah 1:21
- f. Gedaliah becomes Governor of Judah. All the people of Judah fled in panic to Egypt. 2 Kings 25:22-26
- g. Gedaliah vowed the Babylonians meant no harm. Some Jews who had left returned. Jeremiah 40:7-12
- h. Gedaliah refused to believe Johanan that King Baalis sent Ishmael to kill him. Jeremiah 40:13-16
- i. Gedaliah was eating at Mizpah with Ishmael when he and ten others killed Gedaliah. Jeremiah 41:1-3
- j. Ishmael's men killed all but ten men. Johanan went after them and rescued all ten. Jeremiah 41:4-18

August 29

- a. People asked Jeremiah to pray for what they should do. God said to stay in this land. Jeremiah 42:1-22
- b. The people said, "You lie! The Lord hasn't forbidden us to go to Egypt." So they went. Jeremiah 43:1-7
- c. Jeremiah laid rocks under the pavement stone in Egypt representing Babylon coming. Jeremiah 43:8-13
- d. Judeans living in Egypt kept worshiping idols they made provoking God's anger. Jeremiah 44:1-14
- e. Judeans living in Egypt continues to worship idols, doing whatever they wanted. Jeremiah 44:15-30
- f. Ezekiel records Jerusalem's fall on January 8, 585BC. Ezekiel gets his voice back. Ezekiel 33:21-33

August 30

- a. What sorrow awaits you, shepherds, who feed yourselves instead of your flocks. Ezekiel 34:1-10
- b. The Lord says He will be like a shepherd looking for his scattered flock. Ezekiel 34:11-20
- c. And I will set over them one shepherd, my servant David (Jesus, the line of David). Ezekiel 34:21-24
- d. I will make a covenant of peace with my people... You are my people. I am your God. Ezekiel 34:25-31
- e. God said, "I am your enemy, O Mount Seir (Edom) and I will raise my fist against you." Ezekiel 35:1-15
- f. I'm bringing you back, not because you deserve it but to protect my holy name. Ezekiel 36:1-24
- g. I will give you a new heart and a new spirit. I will put my Spirit in you. Ezekiel 36:25-38

August 31

- a. The Spirit of the Lord carried Ezekiel to a valley filled with bones. Can they live again? Ezekiel 37:1-8
- b. Speak come O breath from the four winds. Ezekiel did and a great living army stood. Ezekiel 37:9-14
- c. One piece of wood represents Judah, the other Israel - hold together as one piece of wood. Ezekiel 37:15-23
- d. My servant David (Jesus) will be their king and they will only have one shepherd. Ezekiel 37:24-28
- e. God gives a message for Gog of the land of Magog, prince who rules Meshech & Tubal. Ezekiel 38:1-23
- f. "Son of man, prophecy against Gog... I am your enemy. I'll drive you toward Israel." Ezekiel 39:1-10
- g. God will make a vast graveyard for Gog and his hordes in the Valley of Gog's Hordes. Ezekiel 39:11-24
