

February 6

- a. Bread (manna) from Heaven. In John 6:32, Jesus – the true Bread from Heaven. Exodus 16:8
- b. Their grumbling against the leaders was really against the Lord. Exodus 16:8
- c. Quail sent. Exodus 16:13
- d. Sabbath kept. Exodus 16:25-26
- e. Two quarts of manna is saved (will be put in the future Ark of the Covenant). Exodus 16:33-34
- f. Moses strikes the rock and water comes out; represents Jesus (1 Corinthians 10:4). Exodus 17:6
- g. Aaron and Hur holds Moses arms up while Joshua beat the Amalekites. Exodus 17:12-13
- h. Moses builds an altar; names it Yahweh-Nissi – means “the Lord is my banner”. Exodus 17:15
- i. Jethro (father-in-law) brings Zipporah, Gershom, and Eliezer to visit Moses. Exodus 18:2-4
- j. Jethro gives Moses wise advise to put leaders in charge of smaller groups. Exodus 18:24-25
- k. Covenant renewed. Exodus 19:3-6
- l. The Lord reveals Himself on Mount Sinai with thunder, lighting in a cloud. Exodus 19:1-25

February 7

- a. God gives the people the Ten Commandments. Exodus 20:1-17
 - 1. No other gods before me
 - 2. Not to make any graven images
 - 3. Do not take the name of God in vain
 - 4. Keep the Sabbath day holy
 - 5. Honor your father and mother
 - 6. Do not kill
 - 7. Do not commit adultery
 - 8. Do not steal
 - 9. Do not lie
 - 10. Do not covet
- b. Proper use of altars; i.e. don't use steps or someone might see your nakedness. Exodus 20:22-26
- c. Fair treatment of slaves. Exodus 21:1-11
- d. “I love my master, my wife, and my children” - represents Christ. Exodus 21:5-6
- e. How to deal with personal injury, eye for eye, tooth for tooth. Exodus 21:12-36
- f. Laws about property. Exodus 22:1-15

February 8

- a. Social laws including give God firstborn son (later will change to give to Levites). Exodus 22:16-31
- b. Justice laws; i.e. in a lawsuit you must not deny justice to the poor. Exodus 23:1-13
- c. Six years sow and reap, seventh year let land rest (important). Exodus 23:10
- d. Three annual festivals: Unleavened Bread, Harvest, and Final Harvest. Exodus 23:14-19
- e. Angel guidance, promises, and blessings. Exodus 23:20-33
- f. Israel accepts covenant and Moses spends 40 days on the mountain. Exodus 24:1-18

February 9

- a. Offering for tabernacle. Exodus 25:1-9
- b. Ark of the Covenant Exodus 25:10-16
- c. Mercy seat. Exodus 25:17-22
- d. Table. Exodus 25:23-30
- e. Lampstand. Exodus 25:31-40
- f. Tabernacle. Exodus 26:1-30
- g. Veil and Most Holy Place. Exodus 26:31-27
- h. Altar of burnt offerings. Exodus 27:1-8
- i. Outer court. Exodus 27:9-19
- j. Olive oil for the lamps that are to be kept burning all night. Exodus 27:20-21
- k. Aaron and sons Nadab, Abihu, Eleazar, and Ithamar set apart as priests. Exodus 28:1
- l. Ephod: 2 pieces with 2 stones with 6 names of tribes of Israel on each stone. Exodus 28:6-14
- m. Breastplate (chest piece): 9 inches square, 4 rows of gemstones for 12 tribes. Exodus 28:15-30
- n. Additional clothing: turban, girdle, robe, coat, bells, Holy to the Lord. Exodus 28:31-43
