

## February 20

- a. On the eighth day the boy shall be circumcised (even Jesus was). Leviticus 12:3
- b. After giving birth the woman is to bring a lamb, 2 turtledoves or 2 pigeons. Leviticus 12:7-8
- c. Show contagious skin diseases to priest: clean or unclean (10 lepers in N. T.) Leviticus 13:1-46
- d. Priest must examine clothing for mildew; if unclean it must be burned. Leviticus 13:47-59
- e. Ceremonial cleansing: 2 birds, cedar, yarn, hyssop, fresh water in a clay pot. Leviticus 14:1-4
- f. Ceremonial cleansing: 1 bird killed (represents Jesus), 1 set free (represents us). Leviticus 14:5-7
- g. More purification cleansing offerings. Leviticus 14:8-32

## February 21

- a. Priest to examine mildewed houses: partial tear down or total. Leviticus 14:33-57
- b. For bodily discharges wash self and contaminated things; isolate 1 or 7 days. Leviticus 15:1-33
- c. Aaron couldn't enter the Most Holy Place anytime he chose, or he would die. Leviticus 16:1-2
- d. Atonement for himself and family first. Leviticus 16:6
- e. One scapegoat (Christ took our sin) and one goat offered (Christ died for sin). Leviticus 16:7-34
- f. Scapegoat carries the people's sins into the wilderness. Leviticus 16:20-22

## February 22

- a. Eating blood forbidden. Leviticus 17:1-16
- b. Sexual sins: no sex with relatives, no homosexuality, no sex with an animal. Leviticus 18:1-30
- c. "You must be holy because I, the Lord your God, am holy". Leviticus 19:2
- d. Don't harvest the grain along the edges of the field or what is dropped. Leviticus 19:9-10
- e. Don't trust idols, steal, cheat, lie, rob, insult the handicapped, gossip, hate, etc. Leviticus 19:4-37

## February 23

- a. Some sins punished by death and some by less means. Leviticus 20:1-21
- b. Clean and unclean animals and birds, only eat clean. No spiritual mediums. Leviticus 20:25-27
- c. Instructions for priests, only one and highest is high priest. Leviticus 21:1-22:16
- d. Worth offerings are without defects, unworthy offerings have defects. Leviticus 22:17-33

## February 24

- a. Work 6 days, rest on the 7<sup>th</sup> day because it is the Sabbath. Leviticus 23:1-4
- b. Passover 14<sup>th</sup> day of first month; next day is Unleavened Bread (left Egypt). Leviticus 23:5-8
- c. Festival of First Fruits: Christ our Passover and Christ the First Fruits. Leviticus 23:9-14
- d. Festival of Harvest: Jesus said pray to the Lord of the harvest to send laborers. Leviticus 23:15-22
- e. Festival of Trumpets: Christ return. Leviticus 23:23-25
- f. Day of Atonement, Christ our atonement. Leviticus 23:26-32
- g. Festival of Shelters: John 7:38 From his innermost being will flow living water. Leviticus 23:33-44
- h. Keep light burning (Christ) and 12 loaves of bread for priests & descendants. Leviticus 24:1-9
- i. Just punishment like eye for eye and life for life. Leviticus 24:10-23
- j. Sabbath year: every 7<sup>th</sup> year the land rests from crops. Not done for 490 years. Leviticus 25:1-7
- k. After 49 years (7 Sabbath years) celebrate the year of Jubilee (freedom). Leviticus 25:8-23

## February 25

- a. Sell land to kinsman redeemer and land is returned every Year of Jubilee. Leviticus 25:24-34
- b. Rules to help the poor and slaves. Leviticus 25:35-55
- c. Land, physical, and spiritual blessings for following God's commands. Leviticus 26:1-13
- d. Disobedience brings destruction. Leviticus 26:14-26
- e. Forewarning of what actually happens for 70 years starting around 600 B. C. Leviticus 26:27-35
- f. God will still remember His covenant with them. Leviticus 26:36-46
