- a. Esau's other name is Edom. Genesis 25:30
- b. Jacob pressures Esau into trading his birthright. Genesis 25:33-34
- c. Like his father, Isaac leaves Canaan during a famine. Genesis 26:1
- d. Like his father, Isaac lies saying his wife Rebecca is his sister. Genesis 26:7
- e. Isaac reaps a hundredfold harvest, becomes a rich man. Genesis 26:12-13
- f. God appears to Isaac in Beersheba, and he builds an altar. Genesis 26:23-25
- g. At 40, Esau marries 2 Hittite wives making Isaac and Rebecca unhappy. Genesis 26:34-35
- h. At age 97, Isaac turning blind; feels his death is near. Genesis 27:1
- i. Esau is told to prepare Isaac a meal and receive the patriarchal blessing. Genesis 27:2-4
- j. Rebecca arranges to deceive the blinding Isaac by substituting Jacob. Genesis 27:5-26
- k. Jacob deceives and receives the blessing intended for Esau. Genesis 27:27-29
- l. Rebecca sends Jacob away that he might escape Esau's revenge. Genesis 27:41-43
- m. Isaac tells Jacob to marry one of his Uncle Laban's daughters. Genesis 28:1-2

January 10

- a. Esau marries Abraham's son Ishmael's daughter to make Isaac mad. Genesis 28:6-9
- b. At Luz, Jacob sees a ladder with angels going up and down on it. Genesis 28:10-12
- c. God confirms to him the Abrahamic Covenant and Blessing. Genesis 28:13-15
- d. Upon awakening Jacob anoints a rock pile and vows to serve God. Genesis 28:16-18
- e. Jacob renames Luz to Bethel which means "House of God". Genesis 28:19
- f. Jacob meets Rachel, his cousin and future wife, beside a well. Genesis 29:9
- g. The beginning of one of history's greatest love stories. Genesis 29:11
- h. Jacob promises Uncle Laban, Rachel's father, to work 7 years for Rachel. Genesis 29:18
- i. After 7 years, Laban deceives Jacob by switching Leah for Rachel. Genesis 29:25
- j. Jacob agrees to work another 7 years to marry Rachel. Genesis 29:27-28
- k. Jacob now has 2 wives, and each gives him their handmaid as wives. Genesis 29:31-35
- l. Jacob's 2 wives and their handmaids bear 12 sons and 1 daughter. Genesis 30:1-24

January 11

- a. Jacob gets rich in the sheep and goat business with Laban. Genesis 30:25-43
- b. The Lord tells Jacob to return home; he starts without telling Laban. Genesis 31:3-21
- c. Laban chases Jacob down and makes accusations against him. Genesis 31:22-42
- d. Laban and Jacob make a treaty/covenant. Genesis 31:44
- e. They make a stone monument called Jegar-sahadutha (witness pile). Genesis 31:47-48

January 12

- a. Jacob learns that Esau is on his way with 400 men to meet him. Genesis 32:6-7
- b. Full of fear, Jacob wrestles God all night long by Brook Jabbok. Genesis 32:24
- c. Jacob gets his hip wrenched out of socket. Genesis 32:25
- d. God changes his name to Israel because he fought with God and won. Genesis 32:27-28
- e. Jacob names the place Peniel which means "Face of God". Genesis 32:30
- f. Jacob and Esau make peace. Genesis 33:1-15
- g. Jacob agrees to go to Esau's but goes to Succoth then Shechem. Genesis 33:16-20

- h. Shechem rapes Dinah and falls in love with her, desiring to marry her. Genesis 34:1-4
- i. Jacob's sons deceive Hamor saying all males should be circumcised to marry. Genesis 34:13-24
- j. 3 days later, Simeon and Levi, Dinah's full brothers, kill all the males. Genesis 34:25-26
- k. God tells Jacob to move to Bethel, settle and build an altar. Genesis 35:1-5
- l. Jacob renames Bethel El-bethel (means God of the house of God). Genesis 35:6-7
- m. Jacob and clan leave Bethel; headed to Ephrath which is Bethlehem. Genesis 35:16
- n. Rachel dies delivering the baby naming him Ben-oni (son of my sorrow). Genesis 35:16-18
- o. Jacob changes his name to Benjamin (son of my right hand). Genesis 35:18
- p. Reuben has an adulterous relationship with his dad's wife Bilhah. Genesis 35:22

January 13

- a. Descendants of Esau known as Edom. Genesis 36:1-19
- b. Sons of Esau: Elisha, Reuel, Jeush, Jalam, and Koran. 1 Chronicles 1:35-37
- c. Descendants of Esau known as Edom. Genesis 36:20-30
- d. Descendants of Esau. 1 Chronicles 1:38-42
- e. Kings of Edom. Genesis 36:31-43
- d. Kings of Edom. 1 Chronicles 1:43-54
- g. Israel's (Jacob's) sons. 1 Chronicles 2:1-2

January 14

- a. 17 year old Joseph is loved best and gets robe from Jacob. Genesis 37:1-4
- b. Joseph tells his dreams of his family bowing down to him. Genesis 37:5-11
- c. Joseph: thrown in pit, sold into Egypt, Potiphar's slave in charge. Genesis 37:12-36
- d. Judah moves, marries, has sons Er, Onan, and Shelah. Genesis 38:1-5
- e. Er marries Tamar, Er dies, law requires Onan to marry her and dies. Genesis 38:6-10
- f. Judah won't let Shelah marry, Tamar plays harlot to widower Judah. Genesis 38:9-23
- g. Tamar has Judah's twins, Perez and Zerah. Genesis 38:27-30
- h. Descendants of Judah, sons of Perez were Hezron and Hamul. 1 Chronicles 2:3-6, 8
- i. Line of Jesus from Abraham: Isaac, Jacob, Judah, Perez, and Hezron.
- j. Potiphar's wife falsely accuses Joseph; he's put in prison and in charge. Genesis 39:1-23

January 15

- a. Cupbearer and Baker's dreams, cupbearer reinstated, baker killed. Genesis 40:1-23
- b. At 180 Isaac dies; Esau and Jacob bury him. Genesis 35:28-29
- c. 2 years after cupbearer is restored, Pharaoh dreams and Joseph freed. Genesis 41:1-14
- d. Joseph reveals the 7 & 7 dreams mean 7 years of feast and 7 years of famine. Genesis 41:15-36
- e. Joseph made second in command of Egypt, right behind Pharaoh. Genesis 41:37-49
- f. Joseph marries Asenath; has 2 sons; oldest is Manasseh, then Ephraim. Genesis 41:50-52
