

### January 16

- a. Joseph's brothers without Benjamin go to Egypt for grain and leave Simeon. Genesis 42:1-38
- b. Brothers return to Egypt with Benjamin. Genesis 43:1-18
- c. Brothers eat with Joseph still not knowing he's their brother. Genesis 43:19-34
- d. After leaving Benjamin is falsely accused of stealing Joseph's silver cup. Genesis 44:1-17
- e. Judah begs to stay in Egypt as a slave to allow Benjamin to return. Genesis 44:18-34
- f. Joseph reveals, forgives, and tells them to go get their father and families. Genesis 45:1-15

### January 17

- a. Pharaoh invites Joseph's family back and Jacob is excited, too. Genesis 45:16-28
- b. Jacob's family moves to Egypt. Genesis 46:1-8
- c. Descendants of Israel (sons of Jacob). Genesis 46:9-27
- d. Jacob's family arrives in Goshen, Egypt. Genesis 46:28-34
- e. At 130 years old Jacob blesses Pharaoh. Genesis 47:1-12
- f. Joseph collects all money, livestock, land, and Egyptians as slaves for food. Genesis 47:13-26
- g. Jacob's family acquire land and populate rapidly. Genesis 47:27

### January 18

- a. 17 Years after arrival Jacob makes Joseph promise not to bury him in Egypt. Genesis 47:28-31
- b. Jacob blesses Joseph, Ephraim, then the oldest one Manasseh. Genesis 48:1-22
- c. Jacob blesses his 12 sons also known as the patriarchs. Judah important. Genesis 49:1-27
- d. First time the 12 sons are called "the 12 tribes of Israel". Genesis 49:28
- e. Jacob is buried at Machpelah with Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Rebecca, and Leah. Genesis 49:29 - 50:13
- f. Joseph calms brothers with "you meant it for harm but God meant it for good". Genesis 50:14-21
- g. Joseph dies at 100. "When God takes you back take my bones with you". Genesis 50:22-26

### January 19

- a. Job from Uz had 10 children, was richest and most righteous man of the East. Job 1:1-3
- b. God gives Satan permission to test Job through his possessions only. Job 1:8-12
- c. Job's children, farmhands, and servants die. All his animals stolen. Job 1:13-22
- d. To hush Satan God allows him to harm Job but not kill him. Job has wife issue. Job 2:1-10
- e. 3 of Job's friends: Eliphaz, Bildad, and Zophar come to comfort him. Job 2:11-13
- f. Job's first speech he curses his birthday, broke, busted and disgusted. Job 3:1-26
- g. Eliphaz first accusation is you are suffering because of your sin. Job 4:7-8

### January 20

- a. Eliphaz continues don't despise the discipline of the Almighty when you sin. Job 5:17
- b. Job's second speech; he responds he wishes he was dead. Job 6:8-9
- c. Job's body is covered with maggots and scabs. Job 7:5
- d. Job's bed and sleep won't even comfort him; he hates his life. Job 7:13-16
- e. Job asks if he has sinned; what has he done and why not forgive him? Job 7:20-21

### January 21

- a. Bildad's first accusation is your children must have sinned. Job 8:4
- b. Bildad continues with repent and seek God's favor. Job 8:5-6
- c. Bildad adds you are suffering because of your sin. Job 8:20
- d. Job's third speech; he responds with unfair punishment. Job 9:16-17
- e. Job continues he cannot argue with God or take God to trial. Job 9:32
- f. Job pleads with God: you pour out your anger on me, directly womb to grave. Job 10:17-19
- g. Zophar's first accusation is you are suffering because you have sinned. Job 11:4-6
- h. Zophar's advise is repent, turn back to God and your face will brighten. Job 11:13-15
