- e. Job is still trusting God. Job 16:19
- f. Job continues in his discomfort and discouragement, eyes swollen from tears. Job 17:7
- g. Bildad's second response is in anger "Speak sense if you want us to answer." Job 18:2

January 24

- a. In Job's 6th speech he responds to Bildad with "You've insulted me 10 times." Job 19:3
- b. Job continues, "I protest, but there is no justice". Job 19:7
- c. False neighbors, friends, servants, and family. Job 19:13-19
- d. Job has escaped death by the skin of his teeth. Job 19:20
- e. Job knows his Redeemer lives and will stand upon the earth. Job 19:25
- f. Zophar's second response to Job, "Still you are suffering because of you sin". Job 20:4-5
- g. In Job's 7th speech he responds to Zophar, "My complaint is only with God." Job 21:4
- h. Job adds, "All your explanations are lie". Job 21:34

January 25

- a. In Eliphaz's third response to Job, "Is no limit to your sins with accusations." Job 22:5-11
- b. Eliphaz's advice again, "Repent and be restored". Job 22:23
- c. In Job's 8th speech he response to Eliphaz with "If I knew where to find God." Job 23:3
- d. "I would go to his court and lay out my case." Job 23:4
- e. Job says, "When he tests me, I will come out as pure as gold". Job 23:10
- f. Job asks, "Why doesn't God bring the wicked to judgement?" Job 24:1
- g. Bildad's third response to Job is "How can a mortal be innocent before God." Job 25:4

January 26

- a. Job's 9th speech response to Bildad, "Whose spirit speaks with you?" Job 26:4
- b. In Job's 10th and final speech he maintains his innocence unwaveringly. Job 27:6
- c. Job adds "The fear,of the Lord is true wisdom, forsake evil is real understanding. Job 27:8
- d. Job continues, "He longs for the past when he had health, wealth, & respect". Job 29:1-11

- a. New guy, Elihu, accuses Job of sin and God is punishing him. Job 32:2
- b. Elihu angry with Job's 3 friends for he is younger & has been listening to them. Job 32:3-4
- c. Elihu plays the mediator between God and Job not playing favorites Job 32:21
- d. Elihu says "You say you are innocent, but you are wrong. I'll show you why". Job 33:9-12
- e. Elihu accuses Job of arrogance with Job's "I am innocent, God took my rights". Job 34:5
- f. Elihu tells Job, "He deserves the maximum penalty for the wicked way he talks". Job 34:36

January 29

- a. Elihu continues with “You claim you are righteous before God”. Job 35:2
- b. Elihu says “God will bring justice if you will only wait.” Job 35:14
- c. Elihu asks “Can wealth and mighty efforts keep you from distress?” Job 36:19
- d. Elihu reminds Job that “God is all powerful, no one tells Him what to do”. Job 36:22-23
- e. Elihu tells Job to “Pay attention and consider the wonderful miracles of God”. Job 37:14
- f. Elihu wise cracks, “Teach the rest of us what to say to God”. Job 37:19
