- d. At 40, Moses kills an Egyptian, flees to Midian, marries Zipporah, son Gershom. Exodus 2:11-22
- e. God hears Israelites groaning and remembers his covenant with Abraham. Exodus 2:24
- f. Moses' family tree. 1 Chronicles 6:1-3a

- g. Descendants of Aaron and Moses. Exodus 6:20-30
- h. Aaron's staff becomes a snake and so does Pharaoh's magicians. Exodus 7:1-13
