- a. Look! The Lord is about to destroy the earth and make it a vast wasteland. Isaiah 24:1
- b. The earth suffers for the sins of its people. Isaiah 24:5
- c. Throughout the earth the story is the same - only a remnant is left. Isaiah 24:13
- d. For the Lord of Heaven's Armies will rule on Mount Zion. Isaiah 24:23
- e. The Lord of Heaven's Armies will spread a wonderful feast (marriage supper?) Isaiah 25:6
- f. The Sovereign Lord will wipe away all tears. Also in Revelation 21:4. Isaiah 25:8
- g. You will keep in perfect peace all who trust in you. Isaiah 26:3
- h. Those who sleep in the earth will rise up and sing for joy! Isaiah 26:19
- i. "In that day" is used 43 times in Isaiah. Isaiah 27:1
- j. Israel will bud and blossom and fill the whole earth with fruit! (Christians?). Isaiah 27:6
- k. What sorrow await Ariel, the City of David (Ariel is Jerusalem). Isaiah 29:1

### July 18

- a. But by trusting Pharaoh, you will be humiliated (saints should only put their trust in God). Isaiah 30:3
- b. Trust instead in oppression and lies, calamity will come upon you suddenly. Isaiah 30:12-13
- c. We will get our help from Egypt. They will give us swift horses for riding into battle. Isaiah 30:16
- d. "This is the way you should go", whether to the right or to the left. Isaiah 30:21
- e. What sorrow awaits those who look to Egypt for help (any help other than God). Isaiah 31:1
- f. Look, a righteous king is coming! And honest princes will rule under him (Jesus). Isaiah 32:1
- g. Until at last the Spirit is poured out on us from heaven (Day of Pentecost). Isaiah 32:15
- h. This righteousness will bring peace. It will bring quietness and confidence forever. Isaiah 32:17
- i. What sorrow awaits you, Assyrians, who have destroyed others (will be destroyed). Isaiah 33:1
- j. In that day, He will be your sure foundation. The fear of the Lord will be your treasure. Isaiah 33:6

### July 19

- a. Come here and listen, O nations of the earth... hear my word. Isaiah 34:1
- b. The Lord's revenge, the year when Edom will be paid back for all it did to Israel. Isaiah 34:8
- c. For Your God is coming to destroy your enemies (mighty to save). Isaiah 35:4
- d. He will open the eyes of the blind, and unplug the ears of the deaf. Isaiah 35:5
- e. It will be named the Highway of Holiness (Jesus said "I am the way"). Isaiah 35:8
- f. What sorrow awaits you who lie awake at night, thinking up evil plans. Micah 2:1
- g. Do not prophesy like that. Such disasters will never come our way! Micah 2:6
- h. Your king will lead you! The Lord Himself will guide you!" Micah 2:13
- i. But you are the very ones who hate good and love evil. Micah 3:2
- j. Jerusalem will be reduced to ruins! (happened in 70AD) Micah 3:12
- k. They will hammer their swords into plowshares (Christians planting Gospel seeds). Micah 4:3
- l. These nations do not know he is gathering them together to be beaten and trampled. Micah 4:12
- m. But you, O Bethlehem Ephrathah, yet a ruler of Israel... (only place in the Bible). Micah 5:2

### July 20

- a. He has a case against His people. He will bring charges against Israel. Micah 6:2
- b. To do what is right, to love mercy, and to walk humbly with Your God. Micah 6:8
- c. You keep only the laws of evil King Omri... Therefore, I will make an example of you. Micah 6:16
- d. For though I fall, I will rise again. Though I sit in darkness, the Lord will be my light. Micah 7:8
- e. Like snakes crawling from their holes, they will come out to meet the Lord our God. Micah 7:17
- f. You will trample our sins under your feet and throw them into the depths of the ocean! Micah 7:19
- g. When Hezekiah realized that Sennacherib also intended to attack Jerusalem. 2 Chron. 32:2
- h. We have the Lord our God to help us and to fight our battles for us! 2 Chron. 32:8
- i. Hezekiah stripped the gold from the Temple, and He gave it all to the Assyrian king. 2 Kings 18:16
- j. But perhaps you will say to me, "We are trusting in the Lord our God!" 2 Kings 18:22
- k. Do not speak in Hebrew, for the people on the wall will hear. 2 Kings 18:26

### July 21

- a. Hezekiah heard the report, he tore his clothes, put on burlap, and went to the Temple. 2 Kings 19:1
- b. The king will receive a message that he is needed at home where I will have him killed. 2 Kings 19:7
- c. Hezekiah went up to the Lord's Temple and spread the letter out before the Lord. 2 Kings 19:14
- d. Isaiah, son of Amoz, sent this message to Hezekiah from the Lord against Assyria. 2 Kings 19:20
- e. Then Isaiah said to Hezekiah, "Here is the proof that what I say is true". 2 Kings 19:19
- f. That night the angel of the Lord killed 185,000 Assyrian soldiers. 2 Kings 19:35
- g. One day while he was worshipping his god Nisroch, his sons killed him with their swords. 2 Kings 19:37

### July 22

- a. This is what the Lord says to Hezekiah, "Set your affairs in order, you're going to die." 2 Kings 20:1
- b. Message God gave to Isaiah for Hezekiah, "I will add fifteen years to your life." 2 Kings 20:6
- c. The sign from the Lord is that the sundial's shadow will move backwards ten steps. 2 Kings 20:20
- d. The Lord tested Hezekiah with ambassadors from Babylon (he failed the test). 2 Kings 20:31
- e. When King Hezekiah was well again, he wrote this poem: I said, "In the prime of my life". Isaiah 38:9-10
- f. Suddenly, my life is over... I am in trouble, Lord. Help me! Isaiah 38:13-14
- g. There was nothing in his palace Hezekiah did not show the Babylon ambassadors. 2 Kings 20:13

### July 23

- a. Voice of someone shouting, "Clear the way through the wilderness for the Lord!" Isaiah 40:3  
John 1:23
- b. "Your God is coming!" He will feed his flock like a shepherd, carrying his lambs. Isaiah 40:9-11  
(Jesus)
- c. God sits above the circle of the earth... He spreads out the heavens like a curtain. Isaiah 40:22
- d. The Lord is the everlasting God, the Creator of the earth. He never grows weak or weary. Isaiah 40:28
- e. Who has stirred up this king from the east, rightly calling him to God's service? Isaiah 41:2  
Cyrus?
- f. I will strengthen you and help you. I will hold you up with my victorious right hand. Isaiah 41:10
- g. I will open up rivers for them on the high plateaus... fountains of water in the valleys. Isaiah 41:18

- h. He is my chosen one, who pleases me... I have put my Spirit upon him. (Jesus) Isaiah 42:1  
Matthew 3:16
- i. He will crush the weakest reed or put out a flickering candle. (Jesus) Isaiah 42:3  
Matthew 12:20
- j. You hear with your ears, but you don't really listen. (Jesus) Matthew 11:15 Isaiah 42:20
- k. Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are mine. Isaiah 43:1
- l. When you go through deep waters, I will be with you. Isaiah 43:2
- m. The Lord says, "For your sakes, I will send an army against Babylon (Medes and Persians) Isaiah 43:14
