- e. They put a ring through his nose, bound him in chains and led him away to Babylon. 2 Chron. 33:11
- f. Then Manasseh finally realized that the Lord alone is God. 2 Chron. 33:14
- g. When Manasseh died his son Amon became the next king of Judah. 2 Chron. 33:20
- h. Amon was 22 years old when he became king, and he reigned in Jerusalem 2 years. 2 Chron. 21:19
- i. The people of the land killed King Amon and made his son Josiah the next king. 2 Chron. 21:24
- j. Josiah was 8 years old when he became king and he reigned in Jerusalem 31 years. 2 Kings 22:1
- k. Jeremiah's ministry began in the thirteenth year of King Josiah's reign in Judah. Jeremiah 1
- l. I knew you before I formed you in your mother's womb. Jeremiah 1:5
- m. Branch from an almond tree means I am watching and will carry out all my plans. Jeremiah 1:11-12
- n. Boiling water spilling from the north means terror is coming from the north. Jeremiah 1:13-14
- o. They will fight you (Jeremiah), but they will fail. For I am with you. Jeremiah 1:19
- p. The Lord gave me (Jeremiah) another message. Shout this message to Jerusalem. Jeremiah 2:1

- f. They will return to the land I gave your ancestors as an inheritance forever. Jeremiah 3:18
