

June 12

- a. God gives Israel victory over Ben-Haddad so he will know “I am the Lord”. 1 Kings 20:23-30
- b. King Ben-Haddad pleads for mercy and Israel’s King Ahab sets him free. 1 Kings 20:31-34
- c. A prophet tells King Ahab that the Lord says you must die for sparing a man I said must die. 1 Kings 20:35-43
- d. Naboth will not sell Ahab his vineyard, so Queen Jezebel has Naboth wrongly killed. 1 Kings 21:1-16
- e. Elijah tells Ahab God will destroy him & his sons & dogs will eat his wife Jezebel. 1 Kings 21:17-26
- f. Ahab humbles himself, so God decides to spare him. 1 Kings 21:27-29
- g. Jehoshaphat’s son marries Ahab’s daughter. 2 Chronicles 18:1
- h. Ahab entices Jehoshaphat to join forces and fight Ramoth-gilead. 2 Chronicles 18:2-8

June 13

- a. The prophet Micaiah prophecies that King Ahab will die in the battle. 1 Kings 22:10-28
2 Chronicles 18:9-27
- b. An Aramean soldier shoots an arrow randomly in the air & strikes Ahab killing him. 1 Kings 22:29-35
- c. King Ahab’s son Ahaziah takes his place as king. 1 Kings 22:51-53
- d. Jehoshaphat goes from town to town encouraging people to return to the Lord. 2 Chronicles 19:1-11
- e. Moab, Ammon, and Edom declare war on Judah; Jehoshaphat cries out to God. 2 Chronicles 20:1-14
- f. God says the battles is not yours but mine, take position & watch the Lord’s victory. 2 Chronicles 20:15-19
- g. Jehoshaphat sent singers out first and God caused the enemy to kill themselves. 2 Chronicles 20:20-24
- h. Three days collecting plunder; on day four they gathered in the Valley of Blessing. 2 Chronicles 20:25-30

June 14

- a. King Ahaziah falls through lattice; Elijah tells his messengers to tell him he will die. 2 Kings 1:1-8
- b. Ahaziah sends a captain & 50 soldiers 3 times to arrest Elijah; 2 get burned up. 2 Kings 1:9-14
- c. Elijah goes with the third group to see Ahaziah who dies just as the Lord says. 2 Kings 1:15-17
- d. Since Ahaziah had no sons his brother Joram rules as king of Israel in his place. 2 Kings 1:17-18
- e. King Joram, King Jehoshaphat, and the king of Edom join forces to fight Moab. 2 Kings 3:4-8
- f. No water for the animals and the Lord tell Elisha the valley will be filled with water. 2 Kings 3:9-19
- g. The next morning water appeared; Moabites think it’s blood; Israel defeats them. 2 Kings 3:20-27
- h. Jehoshaphat son of Asa reigned for 25 years, was a good king but his ships sunk. 1 Kings 22:41-49
- i. Jehoshaphat died, his son Jehoram became king of Judah, he killed his brothers. 2 Chronicles 21:1-4
- j. Jehoram followed the way of the kings of Israel; even marries 1 of Ahab’s daughters. 2 Chronicles 21:5-7

June 15

- a. Elisha will not leave Elijah for the Lord’s about to take him up to heaven in a whirlwind. 2 Kings 2:1-8
- b. Elisha wants a double part of Elijah’s Spirit & to replace him, he must see him go. 2 Kings 2:9-10
- c. Suddenly a chariot of fire appears and takes Elijah away in a whirlwind. 2 Kings 2:11
- d. Elisha picks up Elijah’s cloak, splits the Jordan River, 50 men search 3 days for Elijah. 2 Kings 2:12-18
- e. Elisha throws salt into bad water, it is purified. Jesus said, “You are the salt of the earth”. 2 Kings 2:19-22
- f. 42 boys get mauled by 2 bears for mocking Elisha’s bald head. He goes to Samaria. 2 Kings 2:23-25
- g. The oil (represents the Holy Spirit) doesn’t stop until the jars are filled for a widow. 2 Kings 4:1-7
- h. A woman from Shunem builds a rooftop room for Elisha who then promises her a son. 2 Kings 4:8-18
- i. The boy dies and Elisha prays him back to life. 2 Kings 4:19-37
- j. Elisha throws flour (represents Jesus) into a poison pot and it is purified. 2 Kings 4:38-41
- k. A man brings too little bread (represents Jesus) but everyone eats with leftovers. 2 Kings 4:42-44

June 16

- a. Naaman, commander of the army of Aram, sees Elisha to get healed of leprosy. 2 Kings 5:1-8
- b. Elisha sends a servant to tell him to wash 7 times in the Jordan; he won't but does. 2 Kings 5:9-14
- c. Elisha won't take anything, but Gehazi does, and he gets struck with leprosy for life. 2 Kings 5:15-27
- d. A borrowed ax head swims when Elisha throws a stick (represents cross) into water. 2 Kings 6:1-7
- e. The Arameans have Elisha surrounded but they're surrounded by chariots of fire. 2 Kings 6:8-23
- f. King Ben-Haddad surrounds Samaria causing them to starve, even eating children. 2 Kings 6:24-32
- g. Elisha says tomorrow food will be cheap, but the doubting messenger won't eat it. 2 Kings 6:33 – 7:2
- h. 4 lepers visit the Arameans' camp, but they hear a great army coming, and take off. 2 Kings 7:3-11
- i. The lepers tell their story, the plunder causes the doubter to get trampled to death. 2 Kings 7:12-20
- j. Gehazi tells the king about Elisha's miracle when the dead boy's mother enters in. 2 Kings 8:1-6
- k. Hazael murders Ben-Haddad and becomes king of Aram. 2 Kings 7:7-15

June 17

- a. Judgement on King Jehoram (he will die) and Judah for turning away from God. 2 Chronicles 21:8-20
- b. Jehoram's son Ahaziah reigns in his place. 2 Kings 8:25-29
- c. Ahaziah joins Joram in war against King Hazael. Joram gets wounded. 2 Chronicles 22:1-7
- d. Elisha sends prophets to anoint Jehu the next king of Israel. 2 Kings 9:1-13
- e. Jehu is commissioned to kill the family of Ahab. 2 Kings 9:7
- f. Jehu shoots King Joram & kills him, then Judah's King Ahaziah is shot & killed. 2 Kings 9:14-29
- g. Jehu goes to the palace to kill Jezebel; 2-3 eunuchs throw her off the palace wall. 2 Kings 9:30-34
- h. As the Lord said dogs ate Jezebel's body. 2 Kings 9:30-37
- i. Jehu has the leaders of Samaria bring him the 70 heads of King Ahab's sons. 2 Kings 10:1-17
- j. Jehu tricks the priests of Baal into going into their temple for worship & kills them. 2 Kings 10:18-31

June 18

- a. Athaliah, King Ahaziah's mother, kills all her family except Joash & rules in Judah. 2 Kings 11:1-3
- b. In Athaliah's 7th year of reigning, priest Jehoiada brings out the king's son Joash. 2 Kings 11:4-12
- c. Youngest king of Judah or Israel, 7 year old Joash becomes king. 2 Chronicles 23:1-11
- d. Athaliah shouts, "Treason! Treason!" and is killed at the gate where horses enter. 2 Kings 11:13-16
- e. Jehoiada reforms Judah; destroys Baal's altar, and instructs 7 year old King Joash. 2 Kings 11:17-21
- f. Joash ruled over Judah for 40 years doing what was right as long as Jehoiada lived. 2 Kings 12:1-16
- g. King Joash has the temple repaired. Jehoiada, the priest, dies at 130 years old. 2 Chronicles 24:1-16
- h. Joash turns away from God, kills spirit-led Zechariah, son of Jehoiada. 2 Chronicles 24:17-22
- i. Aram's King Hazael conquers some of Israel; Israel's King Jehu dies, 28 year reign. 2 Kings 10:32-36
