

June 19

- a. Jehu's so Jehoahaz becomes king of Israel and reigns in Samaria for 17 years. 2 Kings 13:1-2
- b. The King of Aram repeatedly defeated Jehoahaz and Israel. 2 Kings 13:3
- c. King Jehoahaz prayed, God heard and helped, but they continued to sin. 2 Kings 13:4-7
- d. King Jehoahaz dies, and his son Jehoash became king for 16 years doing evil. 2 Kings 13:8-11
- e. Judah's King Joash gives gold to Aram's King Hazael to stop him from attacking. 2 Kings 12:17-19
- f. Joash's officers assassinated him, and his son Amaziah became king of Judah. 2 Kings 12:20-21
- g. King Jehoash of Israel visits dying Elisha. Jehoash strikes the ground 3 times. 2 Kings 13:13-19
- h. Elisha dies and is buried; later, a corpse was hastily thrown onto Elisha & revives. 2 Kings 13:20-23
- i. King Hazael of Aram dies, his son Ben-Haddad reigns, Jehoash defeats him 3 times. 2 Kings 13:24-25

June 20

- a. Judah's King Amaziah rules over Judah doing what is pleasing to the Lord. 2 Kings 14:1-7
- b. King Amaziah challenges Israel's King Jehoash to a battle. 2 Kings 14:8
- c. King Jehoash sends him a fable and then defeats him and Judah. 2 Kings 14:9-14
- d. Amaziah defeats the Edomites after sending 100,000 hired soldiers back to Israel. 2 Chron. 25:1-16
- e. Israel's Jehoash dies; his son Jeroboam II becomes king. 2 Kings 13:12-13
- f. In his 41 years as king, God uses evil Jeroboam II to save Israel. 2 Kings 14:27
- g. After Judah's King Amaziah turned away from God, his enemies assassinated him. 2 Chron. 25:25-28
- h. Amaziah's 16 year old son Uzziah becomes king of Judah. 2 Kings 14:17-27
- i. Uzziah reigned 52 years. Zechariah helped him do right in the Lord's eyes. 2 Kings 15:1-5
2 Chron. 26:1-15
- j. God stuck him with leprosy for life for offering incense on the altar in the temple. 2 Chron. 26:16-21
- k. Jonah runs from the Lord: ship, storm, overboard, fish swallows him for three days. Jonah 1:1-17
- l. Jonah in seaweed prays in his trouble, land of the dead, makes vows, spit on land. Jonah 2:1-10
- m. Jonah warns Nineveh of coming judgement, they fast, God spares them. Jonah 3:1-10
- n. Jonah is angry because God mercifully spares his enemy of over 120,000 living in sin. Johan 4:1-11

June 21

- a. During the time of King Uzziah & King Jeroboam II, God gives Amos visions. Amos 1:1-2
- b. God's judgement on people of Damascus, Gaza, Tyre, Edom, Ammon, and Moab. Amos 1:3 – 2:3
- c. God's judgement on His intimate people of Judah & Israel for repeated sin. Amos 2:4 – 3:2
- d. God reveals his plans to his prophets. The lion has roared. Amos 3:7-8
- e. The people of Samaria will be led away with hooks in their noses. Amos 4:2
- f. God sings a funeral song, come back to me and live, hate evil and love what is good. Amos 5:1-17
- g. The day of the Lord will bring darkness and hopelessness. Amos 5:18 – 6:6
- h. God is about to bring an enemy (King of Assyria) to oppress them (around 722 BC). Amos 6:14

June 22

- a. The five visions of judgement, the locust and fire God relents on. Amos 7:1 – 9:10
- b. Locusts: small yet eat up all the crops after the king gets his part (the first harvest). Amos 7:1-3
- c. Fire: burns the depths of the sea and all the land; Amos pleads God to stop. Amos 7:4-6
- d. Plumbline: their religion and those of King Jeroboam are crooked, out of line. Amos 7:7-9
- e. Opposition from Amaziah & Jeroboam, Amos speaks truthful words from the Lord. Amos 7:10-17
- f. Ripe Fruit: ripe for judgement, earthquake from God, famine for the Word of God. Amos 8:1-14
- g. God at the altar: no one escapes, nothing can save them, they're like other nations. Amos 9:1-10
- h. God promises to bring his exiled people back to Israel. Amos 9:11-15
- i. Jeroboam II dies, his son Zechariah became the king of Israel. 2 Kings 14:28-29
- j. After 6 months, Shallum assassinates Zechariah & becomes kings, 4th generation. 2 Kings 15:8-12
- k. Shallum reigns 1 month, Menahem assassinates him & becomes Israel's next king. 2 Kings 15:13-15
- l. Menahem pays the king of Assyria to stop his attacks, his son Pekahiah next king. 2 Kings 15:21-22
- m. Pekah assassinates evil Pekaniah to become the next king of Israel. 2 Kings 15:23-26
- n. Assyrian King Tiglath-pileser attacks Israel during Pekahiah's 20 year reign. 2 Kings 15:27-29
- o. King Uzziah dies after 52 year reign, and his son Jotham became king. 2 Kings 15:6-7
- p. I saw the Lord sitting on his throne, high and lifted up, his train filled the temple. Isaiah 6:1
- q. "Here am I. Send me". The Lord calls Isaiah in the year King Uzziah of Judah dies. Isaiah 6:1-13

June 23

- a. Uzziah's son Jotham rules in Judah & does right, dies and his son Ahaz is king. 2 Kings 15:32-38
- b. Micah gets a grieving message from God when Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah reign. Micah 1:1-16
- c. King Ahaz of Judah does evil; Aram & Israel attack, he pays Assyria to help fight. 2 Kings 16:1-9
- d. Israel's King Pekah kills 120,000 Judean warriors, captures 200,000; he frees them. 2 Chron. 28:1-15
- e. Isaiah tells Ahaz they won't be attacked and within 65 years Israel will be destroyed. Isaiah 7:1-9
- f. The virgin will conceive a child called Immanuel (God is with us); Jesus is foretold. Isaiah 7:10-25

June 24

- a. The king of Assyria will shortly carry away the riches of Damascus and Samaria. Isaiah 8:1-10
- b. Strong warning from the Lord, fear him, he will keep you safe, also a stumbling rock. Isaiah 8:11-22
- c. The Messiah is coming to bring hope, called Wonderful, Counselor, Mighty God. Isaiah 9:1-7
- d. Israel will be destroyed in a single day by the Assyrians and Arameans. Isaiah 9:8 – 10:4
- e. After God uses Assyria he will punish their King because he is proud & arrogant. Isaiah 10:5-19
- f. The remnant left in Israel will trust in the Lord and he will protect them. Isaiah 10:20-34
- g. The Spirit of the Lord will rest on Jesus, the wolf and lamb will lie together. Isaiah 11:1-16
- h. All Christians coming together as the New Testament Israel that Paul speaks of. Isaiah 11:11

June 25

- a. A song of praise to the Lord for his Salvation which is Jesus. Isaiah 12:1-6
- b. Damascus will disappear, and Israel will be desolate but will return to the Lord. Isaiah 17:1-14
- c. King Ahaz of Judah asks the King of Assyria for help but gets attacked instead. 2 Chron. 28:16-21
- d. King Ahaz has a new altar put in place of the old bronze altar in front of the temple. 2 Kings 16:10-18
- e. King Ahaz continued to reject the Lord, other gods ruined him, temple doors shut. 2 Chron. 28:22-25
- f. Hezekiah reigns jointly with his father King Ahaz, he trusted God, no one like him. 2 Kings 18:1-8
- g. Hoshea becomes king after he assassinates Pekah, King of Israel. 2 Kings 15:30-31
- h. Hosea prophecies when Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah were Judea kings. Hosea 1:1
- i. "Marry a prostitute", marries Gomer, son Jezreel, God breaks power in Jezreel Valley. Hosea 1:2-5
- j. Daughter Lo-ruhamah 'not loved', son Lo-ammi 'not my people'. Hosea 1:6-9
- k. In that day, call brothers Ammi 'my people', and sisters Ruhamah 'the ones I love'. Hosea 2:1
- l. Charges against Israel the unfaithful wife. Hosea 2:2-13
