- b. Hosea buys his wife back to love her, no sex means no king until King Jesus. Hosea 3:1-5
- c. God's complaint is with the priests, the people do what they do, Israel are idolaters. Hosea 4:1-19
- d. Both Israel and Judah will fall because of their leaders. Hosea 5:1-15
- e. Hosea and God want their wives to love them back so they can restore them. Hosea 6:1-11
- f. Israel's sin is too great for God to heal them, and they plot evil against him. Hosea 7:1-16
- g. It's too late for God to help, kings not appointed by God, Israel worships golden calf. Hosea 8:1-6
- h. Israel planted the wind and will harvest the whirlwind. Hosea 8:7
- i. God will send down fire and burn up their fortresses. Hosea 8:14

- a. Israel's punishment will come through Assyria and Egypt. Hosea 9:1-9
- b. Finding Israel was like finding grapes in the desert, you will be homeless wanderers. Hosea 9:10-17
- c. Israel will beg the mountains to bury them, Israel and Judah will pull the plow. Hosea 10:1-15
- d. I called my son out of Egypt also refers to Jesus being called out of Egypt as a child. Hosea 11:1
- e. They will serve Assyria, but God will bring them home again. Hosea 11:2-11
- f. Israel surround me with lies, Judah obeys, now God brings charges against Judah. Hosea 11:12 - 12-14
- g. Ephraim was important to Israel, but Ephraim sinned by worshipping Baal. Hosea 13:1
- h. Samaria must bear the consequences of their guilt, they will be killed by an invading army. Hosea 13:2-16
- i. Return to the Lord and He will heal them, they will blossom like the lily. Hosea 14:1-9

- a. Sorrow awaits the proud city of Samaria, until the Lord is Israel's glorious crown. Isaiah 28:1-6
- b. God will spell out his message for them line upon line, a little here and a little there. Isaiah 28:13
- c. God is placing a foundation stone firm and tested in Jerusalem (Jesus). Isaiah 28:16
- d. He (Jesus) will come to do a strange thing, to crush the whole land. Isaiah 28:21-22
- e. Does a farmer always plow and never sow? Isaiah 28:24-29
- f. King Shalmaneser of Assyria attacks Israel and for 3 years he besieges Samaria. 2 Kings 17:5; 18:9
- g. Samaria falls, Israelites are exiled to Assyria for 2 calf idols and child sacrificing. 2 Kings 17:6-23
- h. Foreigners settle in Israel, God sends lions, an exiled priest returns to teach religion. 2 Kings 17:24-41
- i. Isaiah saw visions during the reigns of Uzziah, Jotham, Ahaz, and Hezekiah. Isaiah 1:1
- j. Israel does not know it's master, Jerusalem stands abandoned, wash yourselves. Isaiah 1:2-16
- k. Though your sins are like scarlet, I will make them white as snow. Isaiah 1:17-19

## June 29

- a. Faithful Jerusalem has become a prostitute, will be called again Home of Justice. Isaiah 1:21-31
- b. In the last days people from many nations will come to God, walk in the Lord's light. Isaiah 2:1-5
- c. They will hide in caves in the rocks (their religion) from the terror of the Lord. Isaiah 2:6-22
- d. For Jerusalem will stumble and Judah will fall because they refused to obey him. Isaiah 3:1-15
- e. Judgement for Jerusalem is she will be ravaged, her men killed by the sword. Isaiah 3:16-27
- f. 7 women will marry 1 man, our own food and clothing, your name, false churches. Isaiah 4:1
- g. In that day the branch of the Lord will be beautiful and glorious, (speaking of Jesus). Isaiah 4:2-6
- h. Israel is God's vineyard, Judah his pleasant garden, he will let it be destroyed. Isaiah 5:1-7
- i. My people will go into exile far away because they do not know me. Isaiah 5:8-19
- j. What sorrow for those who say that evil is good and good is evil. Isaiah 5:20

## June 30

- a. Judah's King Ahaz dies, and his son Hezekiah becomes the next king. 2 Kings 16:1-20
- b. Isaiah's message against Babylon, call up an army against Babylon. Isaiah 13:1-16
- c. God will stir up the Medes against Babylon, never to be inhabited again. Isaiah 13:17-22
- d. God will choose Israel as his special people once again. Isaiah 14:1
- e. The King of Babylon will be taunted, you will say the mighty man has been destroyed. Isaiah 14:2-11
- f. How you are fallen from heaven, O shining star (Nebuchadnezzar). Isaiah 14:12-21
- g. The Lord says, "I, myself, have risen against Babylon!" Isaiah 14:22-23
- h. Isaiah's message for Assyria, God will break the Assyrians when they are in Israel. Isaiah 14:24-27
- i. The year Ahaz died, Isaiah's message to the Philistines, I will wipe you out with famine. Isaiah 14:28-31
- j. Tell the Philistines the Lord has built Jerusalem, its walls will give refuge... Isaiah 14:32
- k. Isaiah's message for Moab, God's heart weeps for Moab for it will be destroyed. Isaiah 15:1-9
- l. God will establish a descendant of David as king (Jesus?); the glory of Moab ends. Isaiah 16:5-14

## July 1

- a. Ahaz abandoned the Temple, King Hezekiah reopened the doors of the Temple. 2 Chron. 29:3-17
- b. The Levites cleansed the entire temple of the Lord, the entire assembly worshiped. 2 Chron. 29:18-36
- c. Not enough priests purified to have Passover on time, would be 1 month later. 2 Chron. 30:1-5
- d. Judah and Israel were invited by runners carrying letters, some laughed, some came. 2 Chron. 30:6-22
- e. It was the biggest Passover celebration since the days of King Solomon. 2 Chron. 30:23-27
- f. The Israelite attendees left and smashed idols, altars, shrines, and Asherah poles. 2 Chron. 31:1-3
- g. Hezekiah asked for tithes and the money piled up. Hezekiah sought God with all. 2 Chron. 31:4-21

## July 2

- a. Proverbs of Solomon collected by King Hezekiah's advisors. Proverbs 25:1
- b. Patience can persuade a prince, and soft speech can break bones. Proverbs 25:15
- c. Do you like honey? Too much will make you sick. Too much of a good thing. Proverbs 25:16
- d. If your enemies are hungry feed them. It's like heaping burning coals on their heads. Proverbs 25:21-22
- e. Don't answer the arguments of fools/be sure to answer the arguments of fools. Proverbs 26:4-5
- f. Don't interfere in others arguments. It's like yanking a dog's ears. Proverbs 26:17
