

March 6

- a. Moabite King Balak asks Balaam son of Beor to curse Israel. Numbers 22:4-5
- b. God tells Balaam not to curse Israel for they have been blessed. Numbers 22:12
- c. Balaam's talking donkey stops him from being killed by the Angel of the Lord. Numbers 22:21-41
- d. Balaam tries to curse Israel but blesses instead. Numbers 23:7-12
- e. Balaam tries a second time to curse Israel at a different place and again blesses. Numbers 23:13-26
- f. Balaam tries a third time to curse Israel from another place & again blesses Israel. Numbers 23:27-24:14
- g. Balaam gives a final prophecy which speaks of King David & is fulfilled in Christ. Numbers 24:15-25

March 7

- a. Israel worship Baal. Numbers 25:1-5
- b. Phinehas, grandson of Aaron, saves the day killing the man & woman; 24,000 die. Numbers 25:6-15
- c. God tells Moses to attack and destroy the Midianites. Numbers 25:16-18
- d. Israel's second census of males 20 and over excluding the Levites; 691,730. Numbers 26:1-51
- e. Moses is to divide the land; larger the tribe larger the land. Numbers 26:52-56
- f. Tribe of Levi has 23,000 males; month or more they get no land (they'll be scattered). Numbers 26:57-62
- g. Not one person counted in the first census counted this time; they died in the wilderness. Numbers 26:63-65

March 8

- a. Zelophehad only had daughters; God told Moses to give them land; must marry cousins. Numbers 27:1-11
- b. Joshua, who has the Spirit in him, chosen by God to lead Israel. Numbers 27:12-23
- c. Daily offerings. Numbers 28:1-8
- d. Sabbath offerings. Numbers 28:9-10
- e. Monthly offerings. Numbers 28:11-15
- f. Passover offerings. Numbers 28:16-25
- g. Festival of Harvest offerings. Numbers 28:26-31
- h. Festival of Trumpets offerings. Numbers 29:1-6
- i. Day of Atonement offerings. Numbers 29:7-11
- j. Festival of Shelters offerings. Numbers 29:12-40

March 9

- a. Laws concerning vows. Numbers 30:1-16
- b. For leading them into idolatry, Moses to take revenge on the Midianites, then he'll die. Numbers 31:1-2
- c. Balaam, son of Beor, is killed. Numbers 31:8
- d. Moses upset because women allowed to live knowing they led Israel into idolatry. Numbers 31:15-16
- e. Division of the spoils from the Midianites, first give the Lord His share. Numbers 31:25-54

March 10

- a. Reuben, Gad & ½ the tribe of Manasseh ask for land on east side of Jordan River. Numbers 32:1-5
- b. They promise to fight with the other 9½ tribes until the land on west side is taken. Numbers 32:27
- c. Moses assign land to Reuben, Gad & ½ of the tribe of Manasseh on east side of Jordan. Numbers 32:33
- d. Forty years of journey. Numbers 33:1-49
- e. Drive out the inhabitants or they'll be thorns in your sides. Numbers 33:50-56
New Testament Christians are leaders.

March 11

- a. Boundaries of Israel. Numbers 34:1-15
- b. The leader of each of the 10 tribes will help divide the land. Numbers 34:16-29
- c. Levites get 48 towns, scattered around other 12 tribes to be close to synagogues. Numbers 35:1-8
- d. Six of Levities cities are to be cities of refuge, Numbers 35:13
three on the east side & three on the west side of Jordan.
- e. Refuge cities are a place for people who accidentally kill someone. Numbers 35:15
- f. Intentional murderers must be put to death. Numbers 35:16
- g. Accidental slayer leaves refuge city limits; avenger (close relative) may kill him. Numbers 35:26
- h. Women (Zelophehad's daughters) who inherit property must marry in their tribe. Numbers 36:6-7

March 12

- a. Moses identified as author of these books and final instructions. Deuteronomy 1:1
- b. 11 day journey took 40 years. Deuteronomy 1:2-3
- c. Moses reviews the journey starting at Mount Sinai. Deuteronomy 1:6
- d. Moses appointed leaders from each tribe to help judge the people. Deuteronomy 1:13
- e. At Kadesh-Barnea, they sent 12 spies to check out the land and inhabitants. Deuteronomy 1:23
- f. Israel refused to fight the giants and take the promised land. Deuteronomy 1:28
- g. 38 years of wandering in the wilderness. Deuteronomy 2:1-25
- h. All men old enough to fight 38 years ago died in the wilderness as the Lord vowed. Deuteronomy 2:14
- i. Israel got victory over King Sihon of Heshbon after he refused them passage. Deuteronomy 2:26-37
- j. Victory over King Og of Bashan whose bed was over 13 feet long. Deuteronomy 3:1-11
- k. Reuben, Gad, & ½ of the tribe of Manasseh got their land east of the Jordan River. Deuteronomy 3:12-20
