

March 27

- a. Judah's land includes Ziklag, Jezreel and Jerusalem (with Jebusites). Joshua 15:20-63
- b. Land the two sons of Joseph got: Ephraim and West of the Jordan Manasseh. Joshua 16:1-3
- c. Ephraim's land include touching Jericho to the Jordan to the Mediterranean. Joshua 16:4-10
- d. ½ tribe of Manasseh west of the Jordan River included Zelophehad's daughters. Joshua 17:1-6
- e. Several towns inside Manasseh's territory actually belonged to Ephraim. Joshua 17:7-18

March 28

- a. Tabernacle set up at Shiloh (means The Sent, Peaceable, Messiah). Genesis 49:10 Joshua 18:1
- b. Tabernacle at Shiloh 300 years then city destroyed and burned (important). Joshua 18:1
- c. 21 men from the 7 tribes explore and map remaining land. Levites get no land. Joshua 18:2-10
- d. Benjamin has a boundary adjacent to Judah. Joshua 18:11-20
- e. Benjamin gets Jericho, Bethel, Gibeon, etc. Joshua 18:21-28
- f. Simeon gets Beersheba, Sheba, etc., also gets Ziklag from Judah. Joshua 19: 1-9
- g. Zebulun gets Bethlehem among its towns. Joshua 19:10-16
- h. Issachar gets the fourth of the last seven allotments, 16 towns. Joshua 19:17-23
- i. Asher gets 22 towns including Carmel. Joshua 19:24- 31
- j. Naphtali gets 19 towns. Joshua 19:32-39
- k. Dan gets the seventh and final allotment of the remaining land. Joshua 19:40-48

March 29

- a. Joshua is given the land he chooses Timnath-Sarah in Ephraim. Land's divided. Joshua 19:49-51
- b. Cities of refuge for those who accidentally kill somebody. Joshua 20:1-9
- c. Levites get 48 towns taken from all the tribes, they are scattered across Israel. Joshua 21:1-45
- d. Territories for the Levites. 1 Chronicles 6:54-81

March 30

- a. Reuben, Gad, and ½ tribe of Manasseh go back to the east side of the Jordan River. Joshua 22:1-9
- b. Reuben, Gad, and ½ tribe of Manasseh build a huge altar, almost starts a war. Joshua 22:10-34
- c. Old Joshua's final words: follow Moses' words, the Lord did it; don't intermarry. Joshua 23:1-16
- d. Lord's covenant renewed: fear the Lord, serve Him wholeheartedly, yes, we will. Joshua 24:1-28
- e. But, as for me and my family, we will serve the Lord. Joshua 24:15
- f. Joshua dies at 110; Joseph's bones finally buried at Shechem as promised. Joshua 24:29-33

March 31

- a. The Judges Stage: called the Dark of Ages of Israel and lasted about 300 years. Judges
- b. Men of Judah attack Jerusalem and capture it. Judges 1:8
- c. Caleb promises his daughter to whoever captures Kiriath-sepher; Othniel does. Judges 1:12-13
- d. Failure to drive out the Canaanites and made Canaanites slaves. Judges 1:21-35
- e. First of 20 times the Angel of the Lord is mentioned. Judges 2:1
- f. Everyone did as he saw fit (evil). Judges 2:11
- g. The Lord raises up judges to save His people throughout the judges' lifetime. Judges 2:16-23
- h. The Lord left the Philistines, Canaanites, Sidonians, and Hevites to test Israel. Judges 3:1-6
- i. Othniel, Caleb's son-in-law and nephew, becomes the first judge; last 40 years. Judges 3:7-11
- j. After 18 years of serving King Eglon, Ehud becomes second judge for 80 years. Judges 3:12-30

April 1

- a. Shamgar, who once killed 600 Philistines with an ox goad becomes third judge. Judges 3:31
- b. Deborah becomes fourth judge after helping fight Sisera, killed by Jael. Judges 4:1-24
- c. Song of Deborah, "most blessed among women is Jael, wife of Heber..." Judges 5:1-30
- d. Deborah and Barak judge for 40 years. Judges 5:31
- e. Angel of the Lord calls Gideon "mighty hero". Yahweh-Shalom (Lord is peace). Judges 6:1-24
- f. Gideon tears down Asherah pole. Gideon puts out a fleece, twice. Judges 6:25-40

April 2

- a. Gideon, also known as Jerub-baal, has 32,000 men. The Lord weans them to 300. Judges 7:1-8
- b. After hearing Midianites talk Gideon defeats Midianites with torch, jar, & a horn. Judges 7:9-25
- c. Gideon chases down and kills Zebah and Zalmunna, kings of Midian. Judges 8:1-21
- d. Gideon judges for 40 years. His downfall is a scared Ephod. Judges 8:22-35
- e. Gideon's son, Abimelech, rules over Shechem after killing his 70 half-brothers. Judges 9:1-6
- f. Jotham, youngest son of Gideon, gives the first fable in the Bible. Judges 9:7-21
