

### May 22

- a. Solomon builds a palace for himself that took 13 years. 1 Kings 7:1
- b. Solomon built the Palace of the Forest of Lebanon, Hall of Pillars, and Hall of Justice. 1 Kings 7:2-12
- c. Solomon got a man skilled in metalwork named Hiram, from Tyre. 1 Kings 7:13-14
- d. Hiram built 2 pillars (Jakin and Boaz) 27 feet tall, and 18 feet around, set at the entrances. 1 Kings 7:15-22
- e. Hiram built a round basin, 15 feet across & 7½ feet deep, holding 11,000 gallons. 1 Kings 7:23-26
- f. Hiram made 2 pillars, 2 capitals, 2 chains, and 400 pomegranates. 1 Kings 7:41-42
- g. Hiram also made 10 water carts, the Sea, 12 oxen, ash buckets, shovels, and bowls. 1 Kings 7:43-45
- h. Solomon also made all the furnishings gold in the Temple of the Lord. 1 Kings 7:48-51
- i. Solomon also made a bronze altar 30 feet long, 30 feet wide, & 15 feet high. 2 Chronicles 4:1

### May 23

- a. Solomon had the Ark of the Covenant brought from Zion to the Most Holy Place. 1 Kings 8:1-9
- b. In a thick cloud the glorious presence of the Lord filled the Temple of the Lord. 1 Kings 8:10
- c. With the Temple finished, Solomon brought in all the silver, gold, and gifts David gave. 2 Chronicles 5:1
- d. Only things in the Ark of the Covenant were 2 stone tablets of the covenant. 2 Chronicles 5:10
- e. Solomon prayed a blessing on the people. 1 Kings 8:22-52
- f. Solomon finishes the prayer "And now, arise, O Lord, and enter your resting place..." 2 Chronicles 6:41

### May 24

- a. Not one word has failed of all the promises he gave through his servant Moses. 1 Kings 8:56
- b. Solomon offered the Lord a peace offering of 22,000 cattle & 120,000 sheep. 1 Kings 8:62
- c. They celebrated 14 days - 7 for the dedication of the altar and 7 for the Festival of Shelters. 1 Kings 8:65
- d. When Solomon finished praying fire from heaven burned up the offerings and sacrifices. 2 Chronicles 7:1
- e. If terrible things happen to the land it was because his peoples abandoned the Lord. 1 Kings 9:9
- f. Solomon completed everything he had planned, the Temple and the palace. 2 Chronicles 7:11
- g. If my people which are called by my name will humble themselves & pray... 2 Chronicles 7:14
- h. King Hiram pays Solomon 9,000 pounds of gold for 20 worthless towns. 1 Kings 9:10-14

### May 25

- a. Solomon rebuilt the towns King Hiram had given him. 2 Chronicles 8:1-2
- b. Solomon followed the regulations of David to assign the duties for priests and Levites. 2 Chronicles 8:14-16
- c. The Queen of Sheba (believed to be from Ethiopia) brings gifts and questions. 1 Kings 10:1-13
- d. The Queen likely took back Solomon's religion, knowledge, and riches (Acts 8:27). 1 Kings 10:1-13
- e. Each year Solomon received about 25 tons of gold. 1 Kings 10:14
- f. Solomon made 200 large shields and 300 smaller shields made out of gold. 1 Kings 10:16-17
- g. Silver was considered worthless in Solomon's day. 1 Kings 10:21
- h. Solomon had 1,400 chariots, 12,000 horses, and 4,000 stalls. 1 Kings 10:26
- i. King Solomon became richer and wiser than any other king on earth. 2 Chronicles 9:22

## May 26

- a. King Solomon ruled over all Israel with his high officials. 1 Kings 4:1-6
- b. Solomon had 12 district governors who were over all Israel. 1 Kings 4:7-19
- c. The Israelites were as numerous as the sand and were very contented. 1 Kings 4:20
- d. God gave Solomon great wisdom, and understanding, and knowledge. 1 Kings 4:29
- e. Solomon composed 3,000 proverbs and wrote 1,005 songs. 1 Kings 4:32
- f. A Psalm of Solomon, the eastern kings of Sheba and Seba will bring him gifts. Psalm 72
- g. Let the whole earth be filled with his glory. Psalm 72:19
- h. Unless the Lord builds the house, the work of the builders is wasted. Psalm 127:1
- i. Children born to a young man are like arrows in a warrior's hands. Psalm 127:4-5

- b. Their purpose is to teach wisdom, discipline, success, what is right, just, and fair. Proverbs 1:2-3
- c. To give insight to the simple, knowledge, and discernment to the young. Proverbs 1:4
- d. Fear of the Lord is the foundation of true knowledge, fools despise wisdom. Proverbs 1:7
- e. "My child", listen when your father corrects you. Don't neglect your mother's instruction. Proverbs 1:8-19
