- h. Shulamite: How right they are to adore you. Song of Sol. 1:4
- i. King: If you don't know, O most beautiful woman, follow the trail of my flock. Song of Sol. 1:8
- j. Shulamite: The king is lying on his couch, enchanted by my perfume fragrance. Song of Sol. 1:12
- k. King: How beautiful you are, my darling! Your eyes are like doves. Song of Sol. 1:15
- l. Shulamite: You are so handsome, my love, pleasing beyond words. Song of Sol. 1:16
- m. King: Like a lily among thistles is my darling among young women. Song of Sol. 2:2
- n. Shulamite: He escorts me to the banquet hall; it's obvious how much he loves me. Song of Sol. 2:4
- o. It's obvious to believers, we are loved, sought and bought by Jesus.
- p. King: My dove is hiding behind the rocks, behind an outcrop of the cliff... Song of Sol. 2:14
- q. Young Women of Jerusalem: Catch those little foxes, before they ruin the vineyard. Song of Sol. 2:15
- r. Shulamite: My love is mine & I am his (believer knows he's unconditionally loved). Song of Sol. 2:16-17
- s. Shulamite: One night as I lay in bed I yearned for my lover. (She dreams this). Song of Sol. 3:1-5
- t. The wedding is probably verses 3:6 through 5:1
- u. Young Women of Jerusalem: Look it's Solomon's carriage. Song of Sol. 3:6-10
- v. Shulamite: He wears the crown his mother gave him on his wedding day. Song of Sol. 3:11
- w. King: You are beautiful, my darling, beautiful beyond words. Song of Sol. 4:1-15
(Christ died for his bride).
- x. Shulamite: Come into your garden, my love; taste it's finest fruits. Song of Sol. 4:16
- y. King: I have entered my garden, my treasure, my bride! Song of Sol. 5:1

- z. Marriage through the years; probably verses 5:2 through 8:14.
- aa. Shulamite: I slept, but my heart awakes (second dream). Song of Sol. 5:2-8
- bb. Young Women of Jerusalem: Better than all others (Christ is better than all others). Song of Sol. 5:9
- cc. Shulamite: My love is better than 10,000 others. Song of Sol. 5:10-16
- dd. Young Women of Jerusalem: Where has your love gone? (They separate awhile) Song of Sol. 6:1
- ee. Shulamite: I am my lover's, and he is mine. He browses among the lilies. Song of Sol. 6:2-3
- ff. King: You are beautiful, my darling ...as beautiful as Jerusalem. Song of Sol. 6:4-10
- gg. Shulamite: My strong desires had taken me to the chariot of a noble man. Song of Sol. 6:11-12
- hh. Young Women of Jerusalem: Return, return to us, O maid of Shulam (Shulamite). Song of Sol. 6:13
- ii. King: Why do you stare at this young woman of Shulam? Song of Sol.6:13-7:9
- jj. Shulamite: I am my lover's, and he claims me for his own (they get back together). Song of Sol. 7:10-8:4
- kk. Young Women of Jerusalem: Who is this sweeping in from the desert? Song of Sol. 8:5
- ll. Shulamite: I aroused you under the apple tree, where your mother gave you birth. Song of Sol. 8:5-7
- mm. The Young Woman's Brothers: If she is a virgin, like a wall. Song of Sol. 8:8-9
- nn. Shulamite: I was a virgin, like a wall; now my breasts are like towers. Song of Sol. 8:10-12
- oo. King: O my darling, lingering in the gardens. Song of Sol. 8:13
