

September 11

- a. The new Temple did not compare to the old one but would be greater than its past glory.
- b. "Return to me, and I will return to you," says the Lord of Heaven's Armies to Israel.
- c. Unholy will not be made holy, God destroyed their crops, from now on I will bless you.
- d. God's seal of approval and honor is upon Zerubbabel (Zerubbabel's Temple).
- e. 1st of 8 visions of Zechariah: 4 horses the Lord sent out to patrol the earth, prosperity.
- f. 2nd vision: 4 horns are 4 nations that hurt Judah; 4 blacksmiths to destroy them.
- g. 3rd vision: man measuring Jerusalem, will be full of people, God will be the glory.
- h. Exiles called home and "Anyone who harms you harms my most precious possession."
- i. 4th vision: Jeshua snatched from the fire, his sins taken away, fine new clothes.
- j. The Branch and the Lord will remove the sins of this land in a single day (Jesus' death).
- k. 5th vision: a lampstand and 2 olive trees, not by force nor by strength, but by my Spirit.
- l. Do not despise these small beginnings, for the Lord rejoices to see the work begin.
- m. 2 olive trees and 2 olive branches are 2 anointed ones (Spirit and Word).
- n. 6th vision: flying scroll is God's judgement over the entire land.
- o. 7th vision: a woman named Wickedness sitting in a basket is sin; is headed to Babylon.
